

How do I prepare my child for gainful employment or vocation?

In preparing for adult life, help your son or daughter develop and implement a plan towards a meaningful occupation or activity.

- Have conversations with your son or daughter about different occupations and roles.
- Talk to your son or daughter about their interests and values.
- In order to find out what types of future occupations are possible, consult with teachers and other professionals about your son/daughter's aptitudes, strengths, and challenges.
- Job preparation skills can include doing chores at home, doing extra chores for money, and doing volunteer work. Find programs and opportunities that teach pre-employment skills: job hunting, resumes, filling out application forms, interview skills, social & communication skills, job shadowing, and work experiences.
